# 2024 TCJLA / TCJLS & YF Code of Conduct

### Mission Statement

The purpose of the TCJLA is to promote and to sponsor the Tarrant County Junior Livestock Show, Sale, Youth Fair and related activities.

### Non-Discrimination Statement

No qualified 4-H or FFA exhibitor shall be excluded from participation based on race, color, gender, national origin, religion, or disability.

### Definition of Exhibitor

"Exhibitor" means the legal owner of his/her animal/non-animal project(s).

# Youth and Parent/Guardian Participation Code of Conduct

All 4-H and FFA Youth Exhibitors and their Parents/Guardians will abide by the rules set forth in the 2023-2024 TCJLS & YF Rule Book or risk forfeiting all privileges, premium money, belt buckle(s), be ineligible to participate in the TCJLS Sale, and be subject to penalties set forth by the Show Superintendent and the Executive Committee, whose decisions shall be final. 4-H and FFA Youth Exhibitors and their Parents/Guardians shall conduct themselves at all times with respect for others and shall adhere to all Rules set forth in the TCJLS & YF Rule Book. FAILURE TO ADHERE TO ALL TCJLS & YF RULES SHALL RESULT IN PERMANENT DISQUALIFICATION from participation in TCJLS & YF. 4-H and FFA Youth Exhibitors and their Parents/Guardians who violate the TCJLS & YF Rules, or who harass or berate show officials, shall immediately be escorted off premises and risk being barred from the premises for the duration of the TCJLS & YF. Please note that submitting an online entry is an acknowledgement that you have read and understood the TCJLS & YF 2023-2024 Rule Book and are aware of the penalties and consequences regarding any violation of the TCJLS & YF Rules

# **Entry Information**

**Eligibility**: The TCJLS & YF is in support of all youth in Tarrant County, Texas. Exhibitors are individually and personally responsible for knowing and complying with all rules of this show.

Exhibitors must be a member in good standing of a Tarrant County 4-H Club or FFA Chapter and enrolled in a public, private or home school and not be beyond the 12<sup>th</sup> grade. Exhibitors must have continuously, personally, fed and cared for their own individual and personal animal/non-animal projects under the direct supervision of a County Extension Agent (CEA), 4H Club Manager (4HCM), or Agricultural Science Teacher (AST). No project may be substituted for any project after the validation date due to death, sale or other disposition of the project.

Exhibitors may enter as either a 4-H or FFA Member, but not as both. Any Exhibitor who enters as both, will have his/her entries disqualified without refund of entry fees. Exhibitors may not participate in any other county show.

All 4-H and FFA exhibitors are considered to be eligible by the Tarrant County Junior Livestock Association, Inc. (TCJLA) to participate in the Junior Livestock Show at the same time entries are received from the AST/CEA/4HCM. Any AST/CEA/4H-CM who has a member in his/her 4-H or FFA program who becomes ineligible to participate in the Tarrant County Junior Livestock Show, according to Texas Education Code, shall provide notification to the Show Superintendent prior to 7:00 pm on day of show weigh-in.

**Sold Exhibitors:** Animals validated for major livestock shows may also be exhibited at other shows. Be advised, however, that if any validated animal is exhibited and SOLD at any other show (including a county show), the animal will be ineligible to show at any subsequent major livestock show. Additionally, state validated livestock offered for sale during the feeding period via private treaty, private or public auction will be ineligible to show at any subsequent major livestock show. If ownership changes or has the possibility of changing through a sale offering (including animal(s) purchased back by the exhibitor of validation record), regardless of method or length of time, that chain of animal ownership is considered broken and will be ineligible to show at any remaining livestock shows in the feeding period requiring state validation.

A. After the sale of ANY animal that has been State Validated that will not be going on the

floor truck (i.e exhibitor is taking the animal home to finish feeding out for personal consumption, etc) MUST have the State Validation tag replaced with a county tag by the species superintendent and the State Tag must be turned in to the State Validation Chair or Co-Chair.

Entries: Entries shall be submitted by the 4HCM/AST under whose direct supervision the animals or projects were fed, cared for, and will be returned if the entry is turned in by others. The 4HCM/AST shall certify on the entry that the animal or project and the owner are eligible under the rules of the show. All livestock exhibitors must successfully complete the Quality Counts curriculum and on-line test with a passing score of at least 80. 4HCM/AST are responsible for making sure each exhibitor passed Quality Counts before signing the entry forms. It is the responsibility of the 4HCM/AST to read all rules and to check each entry carefully before signing. If entries are not correctly submitted, they will be returned.

Entries for each exhibitor from 4-H Clubs and FFA Chapters must be filed with the TCJLA no later than the time and date specified. Entries must be on-line with a ShoWorks Summary Sheet from the 4HCM/AST listing the owners and their entries along with one check to cover the total entry fees of all entries of each 4-H Club or FFA Chapter. Checks should be drawn on 4-H or FFA accounts. Personal checks from 4-H or FFA members will not be accepted. The ShoWorks summary sheet, recipes and check should be mailed in one package to:

All entries must be mailed to the TCJLA Post Office Box, or hand delivered to the TCJLA executive secretary. Checks, summary sheets and recipes for on-line entries must be postmarked no later than the time and date specified. Late entries will be accepted for up to two weeks after the due date with an additional \$100 PER ENTRY added and collected. If the late \$100 entry fee addition is not paid to the TCJLA PRIOR to February 1 of the current show year, the entry in question will be voided. NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THE LATE ENTRY DEADLINE, NO EXCEPTION, NO APPEALS/PROTESTS WILL BE ACCEPTED FOR LATE ENTRIES.

Entry Date: All entries must be mailed to the TCJLA Post Office Box, or hand delivered to the TCJLS & YF executive secretary. Deadline for on-line entries will be January 18, 2024. ShoWorks summary sheet with total due, checks, and recipes must be postmarked no later than January 18, 2024. If the bank should return the check accompanying the entries, all entries from the 4-H Club or FFA Chapter will be canceled and returned. There will be a \$35.00 service charge on all returned checks. The TCJLA reserves the right to ban any 4-H Club or FFA Chapter from future participation should there be an ongoing problem with collection of fees.

**Project Validation:** Superintendents will have a list of all validated projects to use during check-ins. All exhibited projects must be on the validation list.

**Rabbit validation.** 6-8pm at all locations. January 23, 2024 at Grapevine, January 24, 2024 at Birdville and January 25, 2024 at Arlington. Validation number is not required on rabbit entries, and will be entered at the show form the validation list. If exhibitors wish to enter more validated projects than allowed to exhibit in a division, then ALL validated projects must be submitted on the entry form(s) and appropriate division entry fees paid. All county and/or state validation tag numbers must be written on the entry form for each submitted project entry. The validation number will not be T220, but the actual validation number. If there is no valid ID number, then that animal or project will be immediately disqualified and all fees forfeited.

County Tag In: Complete.

**Showmanship**: Exhibitors are eligible to participate for showmanship in the species in which they have an entry. Pee Wee and Adult competitors are eligible to participate in any species. Age divisions (as of September 1 of current school year) are as follows:

- O **Pee Wee-** Any child 4 to 7 years of age or under may compete. Participants receive a medallion.
- O **Junior** Ages 8 to 10 Winner receives a belt buckle.
- O Intermediate Ages 11 to 13 Winner receives a belt buckle.
- O **Senior** Ages 14 to 19 (Must be a graduating senior in high school) Winner receives a belt buckle.
- O **Adult** Any person over age 19 will be eligible to compete. A \$5.00 entry fee per entry will be assessed at the time of the class, with a 50/50 split payout (50 percent of the adult showmanship entry fees will go to the winner and 50 percent to TCJLA).

# **Superintendents & Judges**

**Judge selection process for show**: By October 1 of each year, each livestock Division Superintendent with a minimum of a 3 person committee will select a list of four judges that are vetted by the group. The proposed judges names will be randomly drawn from the submitted lists and contacted in the order they are drawn. Selected judges who serve will be invited back for two (2) consecutive years, unless the judge chooses not to return or the committee chooses not to invite the judge back. Names of selected livestock judges will be published by the TCJLA.

# **General Information**

### **Silent Auction Guidelines**

• There will not be a Silent Auction at the 2024 Show.

### Use of Signage in and around Barns

- Only TCJLA / TCJLS authorized and approved signage shall be permitted in and around the barns. This **does not include** normal 4-H Club and FFA Chapter stall signage that is hung at livestock events.
- No "For Sale Signs" shall be hung in or around stalls, pens or barn.
- Unauthorized signage will be taken down immediately.
- Raffles or door prizes will not be allowed to take place during the Tarrant County Junior Livestock Show, Youth Fair or Sale.

### **Parking**

- Exhibitors and parents will have a designated area to park during the TCJLS Livestock Show
- Exhibitors and parents will be allowed up to one (1) hour to park close to the barn for unloading purposes.
- Please review TCJLS Rule Book guidelines regarding parking.

**Parking**: TBD. Additional information will be forthcoming as the area around the Swine Barn will be under construction and parking by the barns will be determined once construction begins. The Yellow Parking area should be available for parking.

**Please note** that all the parking area surrounding the Will Rogers Complex is paid parking. The TCJLA will only pay parking for the following: Board of Directors, Show Superintendent, Youth Fair Director, Livestock Division Superintendents, Youth Fair Superintendents, Show Office Manager and Staff, Judges, VIPS, Sponsors, the top 25 buyers, and designated administrative committee members.

**Photographs**: All exhibitors agree to present themselves and their project(s) at the request of the show officials for official photographs. All photographs taken by the officialphotographer become the property of the TCJLA. Exhibitors wishing to purchase photographs must contact the official photographer. All exhibitors that qualify for the Sale will pay a fee for the official photograph taken during the sale. Exhibitors hereby grant TCJLA permission to utilize photograph, image or likeness in whole or part for use in official TCJLA publications and promotions.

Other Photography: Anyone wishing to photograph or film any aspect of the Tarrant County Junior Livestock Show, Youth Fair or Sale must have prior approval from the Executive Officers and Show Superintendent. A TCJLA authorization form must be completed and submitted by January 31 to the Executive Board for consideration. This form can be obtained from the TCJLA Secretary. This authorization form does not apply to media outlets, publications and media approved photographers or to the parents or guardians of participating exhibitors. Family members are to be respectful of other youth exhibitors while photographing or filming.

### Food

- Concessions will be available.
- Please note per our contract with Will Rogers that exhibitors and their families are not permitted to bring in large ice chests and large quantities of food are not allowed in any facility during the show.
- Exhibitors and their families may only bring in enough food to feed their family per day.

### **Buyers Arena**

- Only youth designated to be working will be allowed in the Buyers Arena. ALL other exhibitors and parents are not allowed in the Buyers Arena on Saturday.
- Exhibitors cannot ask a buyer to give back a purchased sale animal. Any exhibitor caught will be subject to penalties stated in this Rulebook, the Code of Conduct and Ethics Form.
- Contact the Show Secretary if you have any questions.

### **Health Regulations**

1. The Animal Welfare Committee will assess the health of entries and comment on conditions needing to be addressed. The Show Veterinarian will provide necessary treatment and recommend any animal that appears unhealthy to be removed from the grounds and barred from the show.

- 2. An award will be presented to the 4-H Club and the FFA Chapter that earn the most points on exhibits shown per club or chapter. In case of a tie, the club or chapter with the least number of exhibits will be the winner.
- 3. Belt Buckles will be presented for Junior, Intermediate and Senior Showmanship in the following divisions: Cattle, Swine, Sheep, Goats, Horses and Rabbits.

Belt Buckles will be awarded to the Champion Showmanship winner in the Junior and Senior age groups of all the Poultry Showmanship Divisions.

Buckles will be presented for all Division Overall Champions and Reserve Champions unless otherwise specified.
